Description: A one-story professional Post Modern office on the northeast corner of First Street and West Franklin Street. The foundation is made of concrete block with stretcher courses of red brick and corner quoins on the elevations. Centered on the south façade is an intersecting gable and entry into the building. The entry door is aluminum and glass with sidelights and a tripartite transom. Above the transom is an arched center window with quarter arched windows on each side. A denticulated frieze board is under the gable with square engaged columns at the corners under the gable. To the east and west of the gable on the south façade is a square bay window with dentils and double fixed windows.

Centered on the west elevation is an intersecting gable with corner engaged columns and frieze board under the eaves. A sign is attached to the brick stating, "AMBS Call Center," with an arched center window and quarter arched windows on each side above. On the east elevation is a side entry flanked by engaged columns with a frieze board and half-hipped roof above.

A pyramidal hipped roof with intersecting gable is on the building covered in asphalt shingles.

Description: A two-story cross gable residential Folk Victorian on the north side of West Franklin Street. The foundation is made of cut coursed stone. Vertical boards with molded string courses at the top and bottom separate the foundation from the white painted wood clapboard siding and corner boards.

Between the first story and second story on the south façade gable is a line of brackets. Centered on the second story of the gable is a coupled two-over-two double hung window with purple painted trim. The upper half of the tympanum is covered in vertical wood boards painted white with purple trim that extends along the eaves past the second story window. To the west of the south gable is a wrap-around porch with square columns, white painted wood clapboard sided balustrade and foundation, and a half-hipped roof. Entry into the building is in the west of the south gable. Above the wrap-around porch, the west slope of the south gable extends down to the porch roof with decorative spindle work below.

The gable on the east elevation is two bays on the first story and one bay on the second story. Decorative spindle work bargeboards embellish the raking edge with vertical white painted wood siding behind it. Some of the windows on the building have a flat roof awning supported by brackets above.

On the west elevation is a gable part of a decorative spindle work bargeboard with vertical siding behind. Between the first and second story is a single row of brackets. A window centered on the second story west gable is boarded up with a flat awning over top.

The cross gable roof extends to the first story on the south side of the west gable and on the north side of the east gable. Asphalt shingles covers the main roof, the half-hipped porch roof, and the flat awnings over select windows.

Description: A two-story cross gambrel residential Folk Victorian on the north side of West Franklin Street with concrete steps leading from the sidewalk to the level of the building. The foundation is made of uncoursed stone with rusticated concrete blocks on the enclosed porch foundation. A wood white painted water table separates the foundation from the wall elevations. All elevations are covered in white painted wood clapboard siding and corner boards with green painted wood shingles in the gambrels. A full length enclosed porch with a

shallow gabled entry is on the south façade. The elevations of the enclosed porch below the window is covered in white painted wood clapboard siding.

Centered on the first story of the east gambrel is a one-story square bay window with brackets on the frieze board and wood inset panels below the window. A cutaway corner on the first story is south of the square bay window with swoop brackets connected by a drop pendant. North of the east gambrel is a one-story shed roof addition.

The cross gambrel roof is covered in green asphalt shingles with a shed roof wall dormer on the east elevation.

Description: A two-story multi-family residential Folk Victorian on the north side of West Franklin Street. The foundation is made of coursed cut stone. All of the elevations are covered in yellow vinyl siding with vinyl corner boards and tan painted wood shingles in the south facing tympanum. Square and fish scale imbrications of shingles are in the tympanum. A full length front porch covers the first story of the south façade. The foundation is covered by wooden

slats with wood stairs on the east elevation of the porch. A gable with tan frieze boards is on the east end of the hipped roof porch. Yellow painted wood clapboard siding covers the balustrade with square columns on top. The wall elevation under the porch roof is covered in vertical board and batten siding. On the east elevation gable is a one story cutaway corner to the southeast with scalloped trim and pendant under the second story.

Asphalt shingles cover the hipped roof with intersecting cross gables and cornice returns.

All elevations are covered in vinyl siding with corner boards. On the south elevation is a front facing gable. The south gable is one bay on the first and second story. East of the south gable is wood decking and stairs leading to the entry. Under the east gable, on the first story is a

shallow canted bay window with white painted bowing fish scale shingles. At the northeast corner of the east elevation is a wood staircase that leads to the second floor.

Description: A one-story residential Eclectic building on the north side of West Franklin Street with concrete steps leading from the sidewalk to the level of the building. The foundation of the building is not visible from ground level. Brown stretcher bond brick makes up the construction of the elevations and chimney with a brick soldier course water table at ground level. Five bays are on the south façade with a central covered entry. The windows on the south façade are fixed divided light with radial divided arched transoms. An arched roof with a kick to the east and west covers the central entry and is supported underneath with side double frieze boards and freestanding columns. The entry is flanked by divided sidelights with a semi-circular arched and radial divided fanlight. To the east and west of the south façade entry are eyebrow dormers with radial divided windows. On the west elevation is a brick chimney centered in the

south gable. To the north and south of the brick chimney are divided light arched windows. Other windows in the building are divided light casements with straight lintels. All windows have brick sills and either straight or arched brick headers.

The roof is hipped with intersecting gables and two front facing eyebrow dormers, all covered in asphalt shingles. Eaves of the roof overhang the brick walls with wood soffits and modillions. Intersecting gables facing east and west have white painted wood boards in the tympanum. Some gables have modillions under the eaves.

East of the building is a one-story pyramid roof garage with brick walls and a white painted multi-panel garage door.

Description: A one-story Commercial Brick building on the northwest corner of Fourth Street and West Franklin Street. The foundation is not visible from the ground level. Tan painted stretcher bond bricks create the wall construction of the south façade with stacked bricks under the fixed windows. Concrete blocks painted tan make up the west and north elevations with tan painted bricks on the east elevation. The storefront of the building is on the south façade but also wraps around onto the east and west elevations. Three groups of aluminum and glass windows with brick between extend along the entire south facade with a fabric awning above. Above the fabric awning are three groups of decorative rectangular inset wood panels. On the south end of the west elevation are an aluminum and glass entrance and fixed windows that continue the storefront with a hipped roof awning covered in asphalt shingles above.

The south end of the east elevation has an aluminum and glass window with a panel transom painted cream. On the transom is a sign reading, "The Design Studio by Z Studios." Three multi-light casement windows with brick sills are centered on the east elevation with a black painted metal loading door at the north end.

The roof is flat with a brick parapet created by the wall elevations extending past the roof decking on the north and east elevations and south façade. A taller brick parapet is on the south façade's west corner with a rectangular sign and a brick cap at the top. Also on the south façade parapet are projecting letters spelling out, "The Design Exchange," with a rectangular brick frame behind, three rows of corbelling and a soldier string course. The rows of corbelling continue onto the east elevation.

Description: A two-story multi-family residential Vernacular building on the north side of West Franklin Street. The foundation is made of stone with a white painted concrete skim coat on the exterior. All elevations are covered in white aluminum siding. On the south façade is a two-story front facing gable with an enclosed half-hipped roof porch. The second story of the gable has a central double-hung wood window with a triple vertical divided upper sash over a single

lower sash. Aluminum siding covers the lower half of the enclosed porch with rows of windows on the upper half. Concrete stairs lead up to the entry. Centered on the east elevation is an exterior red brick chimney with stone capped shoulders on the north and south sides. West of the two-story gable is a one-story hipped roof with a coupled double-hung wood window on the south façade. On the north elevation is a one-story addition with a white-painted concrete block foundation.

The roof on the two-story gable and one-story hips are covered in gray asphalt shingles.

Description: A one-and-a-half story Commercial professional office on the north side of West Franklin Street and a parking lot to the west and north. The foundation is made of concrete block. A mix of red and brown bricks cover the south façade and most of the east and west elevation while vinyl siding and cover boards covers the north elevation and the northern ends of the east and west elevations.

Stacked brick courses, that are raised and indented, separate the fixed windows in the square bay on the south elevation. At the southeast corner is a red painted wood board and batten balcony that wraps around onto the east elevation. Above the balcony is a group of three fixed windows. North of the balcony and extending the length of the brick on the east elevation is a row of fixed transom windows. The brick is terminated in an engaged brick column.

An entrance covered by a hipped roof supported by square columns is at the east end of the north elevation. On the east elevation is a two-story entrance covered by the main roof and supported by square columns. The entrance is aluminum and glass flanked by brick. North of the entry is a row transom windows like on the east elevation that stops at a brick engaged column.

The hipped roof with overhanging eaves is irregularly shaped and covered in asphalt shingles. Vertical vinyl siding covers the fascia board of the overhanging eaves.

Description: A one-story Modern brick professional office on the north side of West Franklin Street. The foundation is not visible from ground level. All of the elevations are covered in brick with wood vertical paneling between the windows. A brick wall extends out from the roof perpendicular to the south façade at the east end where the corner is cutaway. West of the cutaway corner is a fixed window. The south façade brick wall continues out from under the roof at the west end perpendicular to the west elevation.

The west elevation has multiple entrances and transom windows. A one story flat roof section is on the north elevation that is shorter than the entrance. The entrance roof extends out to the north over the aluminum and glass entrance. A brick three quarter wall extends north from the entrance. An entrance is under the cutaway corner on the east elevation with brick on the

south side and wood paneling on the perpendicular wall to the north. A row of transom windows with wood paneling in between is north of the cutaway corner and extends the length of the elevation with a mirror coating on the windows.

The roof is a shallow flat shed sloping downwards to the west. The eaves have aluminum and wood fascia boards.

Description: A two-story professional office Queen Anne on the north side of West Franklin Street behind 730 West Franklin Street. The foundation is not visible from ground level. All of the elevations are covered in white vinyl siding with vinyl corner boards. A wrap-around porch extends the length of the south façade and the west elevation where it turns into a ramp. The foundation of the porch has lattice panels with vinyl siding that continues up onto the balustrade. On top of the balustrade are lathe turned columns supporting a hipped roof. Carpeted stairs with a lathe turned balustrade allows access to the porch on the west end of the south façade. A two-story gable with a central coupled double-hung window flanked by shutters is on the east end of the south façade. In the gable is a flat saw-cut decorative verge board that is painted red. Another gable is to the west with an octagonal stained glass window

and a quarter arched spindle verge board. East of the two-story gable is another octagonal stained glass window.

Centered on the east elevation gable is a one-story square bay window with a gable roof. The north elevation is a double gable with a stairs leading to an entry in the western gable. Two octagonal stained glass windows and a double-hung window flanked by shutters are on the west elevation.

The hipped roof with intersecting cross gables is irregularly shaped and covered in asphalt shingles.

Description: A two-story professional office Colonial Revival on the north side of West Franklin Street. The foundation is not visible from ground level. All of the elevations are constructed of stretcher bond yellow bricks and a concrete water table. Centered on the south façade is a concrete and brick entry stoop covered in an open gable supported by side fascia boards and arched knee brackets. Extending from the open gable is a small hipped roof string course that covers the length of the south façade and wraps around the southeast and southwest corner. The double-hung wood windows in the building vary from eight-over-one to six-over-one to one-over one with concrete sills. At the southeast corner is a one-story addition lined with multi-light coupled casement windows and continuous concrete sills. On the east elevation is a wood ramp with lathe turned balustrades that connect to the north elevation of the one-story

addition. The ramp wraps around the northeast corner onto the north elevation. West of the ramp on the north elevation is a one-story addition with a concrete foundation and elevations covered in white siding with white corner boards. Above the north one-story addition is a door. Another door is centered on the first floor of the west elevation with an exterior brick chimney south of the door.

The roof is a parallel oriented gable roof covered in asphalt shingles with a flat parapet roof on the one-story southeast corner addition.

Description: A two-story gable front vernacular professional office on the north side of West Franklin Street. The foundation is made of rusticated concrete blocks with a black painted water table separating the foundation from the vinyl sided first story wall elevations. On the south façade first story is a partial length covered porch. White painted wood shingles cover the foundation and balustrade with freestanding Doric columns on top of the balustrade. The

half-hipped roof and frieze board on the porch are supported by the Doric columns. White painted wood shingles cover the second story of all elevations as well as the gable tympanums with flared shingles between the stories. A string course and cornice returns close the south front facing gable with a center double-hung wood window.

On the north elevation is an intersecting gable with cornice returns and a center double-hung window. A shed slope continues the east slope of the north gable to cover the northeast corner porch. The foundation and balustrade of the northeast porch is covered in vinyl siding with short Doric columns on top of the balustrade to support the roof. Both stairs and a ramp allow access to the northeast porch with the ramp doubling back along the full length of the north elevation.

The front facing gable transitions to a hipped roof to the north. All roof slopes are covered in gray asphalt shingles.

Description: A two-story residential New Traditional Colonial Revival set back from the road on the north side of West Franklin Street. The foundation was not visible from outside the property fence. White vinyl siding covers the south façade. Entry into the building is west of the two-story gable with a semi-circular stepped stoop, sidelights and a semi-circular fanlight. The second story of the south gable jetties out from the first story wall with drop pendants at the corners and a center coupled double-hung window. Under the second story jetty is a canted bay window with six-over-one double-hung windows. Windows on the south façade, excluding the roof dormers, are flanked by black shutters. All other elevations are not visible from outside the property fence.

The roof is two stacked parallel gables with an intersecting cross gable on the east side of the south façade. A gable roof dormer is on the parallel oriented one-story gable with another dormer between the one-story and overlapping second story gable.

The foundation and balustrade are sided with vinyl siding and corner boards matching the wall elevations. Entry onto the porch is on the east side with stairs

and a lathe turned balustrade. At the southern corners of the porch are square columns on top of the vinyl siding. Above the south porch are two double-hung windows with white shutters. The gable ends on the east and west elevations are closed with cornice returns connected by a string course painted brown. Description: A one-and-a-half story residential Craftsman Bungalow on the north side of West Franklin Street. The foundation is made of rusticated concrete blocks painted gray. White vinyl siding covers all elevations and the foundation of the south porch. On the south façade, the full length porch is under the main roof structure that extends to the first story. Square pilasters and engaged columns are in between the windows on the porch. Decorative radial patterns

cover crawl space holes in the foundation and a concrete stoop leads to the entry. On the roof above the porch is a shed roof dormer covered in white vinyl siding with four double-hung windows. Many of the windows on the east and west elevations are double-hung wood windows with three vertical division upper sashes over single lower sashes. Centered on the east elevation is an exterior brick chimney with concrete capped shoulders on the north and south sides. On the north elevation is a one-story addition. The north roof slope, unlike the south slope, stops at the second story.

Asphalt shingles cover the main gable roof and the shed roof dormer.

porch on the first story. Wood clapboard siding covers the foundation and balustrade on the porch with Doric columns on top supporting the half-hipped roof. Decorative center radiating panels are also in the balustrade.

The hipped roof is covered in asphalt shingles with a central roof dormer on the north façade. Green painted wood shingles cover the dormer with a coupled six light casement window. Under the overhanging eaves of the hipped roof are brackets.
